Policy on Ban on Plastic for CHARUSAT University Campus

1. Introduction

Charotar University of Science and Technology (CHARUSAT) is committed to environmental sustainability and fostering an eco-friendly campus. Recognizing the adverse effects of plastic waste on the environment, the university enforces a **plastic ban policy** to minimize plastic usage, promote sustainable alternatives, and ensure responsible waste management.

2. Objective

- > To eliminate single-use plastics on campus.
- > To encourage the use of biodegradable and reusable materials.
- > To create awareness about plastic pollution and sustainability.
- > To implement waste segregation and recycling practices.
- > To comply with national and state environmental regulations.

3. Scope of the Policy

This policy applies to all students, faculty members, administrative staff, vendors, and visitors within the CHARUSAT campus.

4. Prohibited Items

The following plastic items are banned on campus:

- > Single-use plastic bags
- Plastic straws and cutlery
- Disposable plastic cups and plates
- Plastic water bottles (below 1-liter capacity)
- Plastic packaging for food and beverages
- Thermocol products (such as plates and cups)
- Microplastic-containing products (such as some cosmetics and personal care items)

5. Permitted Alternatives

The university encourages the use of:

- > Cloth, jute, or paper bags
- Stainless steel, glass, or reusable plastic bottles
- Wooden or metal cutlery
- Biodegradable plates and cups
- Paper-based or compostable packaging materials

6. Implementation Strategy

6.1 Awareness and Education

- Conduct workshops, seminars, and awareness drives on plastic waste and environmental sustainability.
- > Display posters, banners, and digital notifications promoting the policy.
- > Include environmental awareness sessions in student orientation programs.

6.2 Monitoring and Compliance

- Regular inspections will be conducted in canteens, hostels, and administrative areas.
- Vendors and shops on campus must comply with the policy and use eco-friendly packaging.
- > Departments must ensure procurement aligns with the plastic ban guidelines.

6.3 Waste Management System

- > Segregation: Separate bins for biodegradable, recyclable, and non-recyclable waste will be installed across campus.
- > Recycling: Collaboration with local recycling agencies for proper waste disposal.
- Reduction: Encouraging students and staff to minimize plastic consumption in daily activities.

7. Penalties for Non-Compliance

To ensure strict adherence, the following measures will be taken:

- First-time violators will receive a warning and awareness session.
- > Repeat violations will lead to monetary fines or community service obligations.
- Vendors or food outlets not following guidelines may face temporary or permanent suspension of their campus operations.

8. Role of Stakeholders

8.1 Students

- Avoid carrying and using banned plastic items.
- > Report non-compliance cases to the designated authority.
- Participate in sustainability initiatives.

8.2 Faculty and Staff

- > Act as role models by following the policy.
- > Educate students about the importance of plastic-free living.
- Ensure proper waste segregation and disposal in their respective departments.
