- The Abstract must be written only in English. The word limit for the abstract is 250-500 words.
- All submissions should be original.
- Please use the following abstract template document to develop your abstract
- All selected abstracts will be eligible for publication as conference proceedings.

## Abstract text format

- All abstracts should be written in English. The abstract should be written in MS Word format in single-spaced in 12 point Times New Roman.
- The abstract should be structured as
  - **Introduction** - Briefly explain the aim and scope of your study (25%)
  - **Method/Experiment** - Focus on the methods (50% or more)
  - **Conclusion** - Brief discussion/conclusions (25%) of the study.

Authors are requested to upload Abstracts (250-500 words length) in electronic form (MS-Word) via the abstract submission email provided on the conference brochure. Please save the abstract file as the "Subtheme\_first name of authors".

Keywords: Three to five words arranged in alphabetical order separated using a semicolon (;).
